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Reported speech.

When do we use reported speech? We use reported speech when we need to say or report something that other person said. There are two ways of report what a person has said: **direct and indirect.**

- 1. **Direct speech:** we repeat the original speaker’s exact words:
Example: He said, “I **like** chocolate.”
- 1. **Indirect or reported speech:** by reporting the words spoken.
Example: He said that he **liked** chocolate

In indirect speech, we often use a tense which is 'further back' in the past) than the tense originally used (e.g. work to worked). This is called '**backshift**'.

Tense	Direct Speech	Reported Speech
Present simple	I like ice cream	She said (that) she liked ice cream.
Present continuos	I am living in London	She said (that) she was living in London.

We also may need to change other words that were used, for example: pronouns, demonstratives and adverbs of time and place

LOOK the examples:

- Ex 1.- 'I enjoy working in my garden,' said Bob. (direct speech)
Bob said that he enjoyed working in his garden. (reported speech)
- Ex 2.- 'We play tennis for our school,' said Alina.
Alina told me they played tennis for their school.

EXPRESSIONS OF TIME AND PLACE IN INDIRECT SPEECH

Adverbs and adverbial phrases of time change as follows: DIRECT SPEECH INDIRECT SPEECH



DIRECT SPEECH	INDIRECT SPEECH
today	that day
yesterday	the day before
the day before yesterday	two days before
tomorrow	the next day/the following day
the day after tomorrow	in two day's time
next week/year etc.	the following week/year etc.
last week/year etc.	the previous week/year etc.
a year etc. ago	a year before/the previous year
