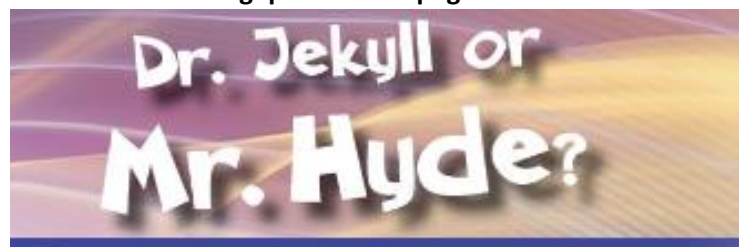

The story of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde was written by Robert Louis Stevenson in 1886. It is about a respected doctor who wants to improve his life. He creates a potion to help him to do it, but when he drinks it, he becomes a different person: Edward Hyde. Dr. Jekyll has a friendly personality, but when he turns into Mr. Hyde, he is cruel and violent. Eventually, Mr. Hyde becomes stronger than Dr. Jekyll.

The story was written before computers, but some people compare the potion to the effects of the Internet on our personalities. Some experts say that many people have an *e-personality*, and that they behave very differently online compared to how they behave in the physical world. Shy people, for example, often become very extroverted on the Internet. Other people share very personal information about themselves and their feelings with complete strangers. People who are patient and polite in everyday life sometimes start posting very rude comments online.
